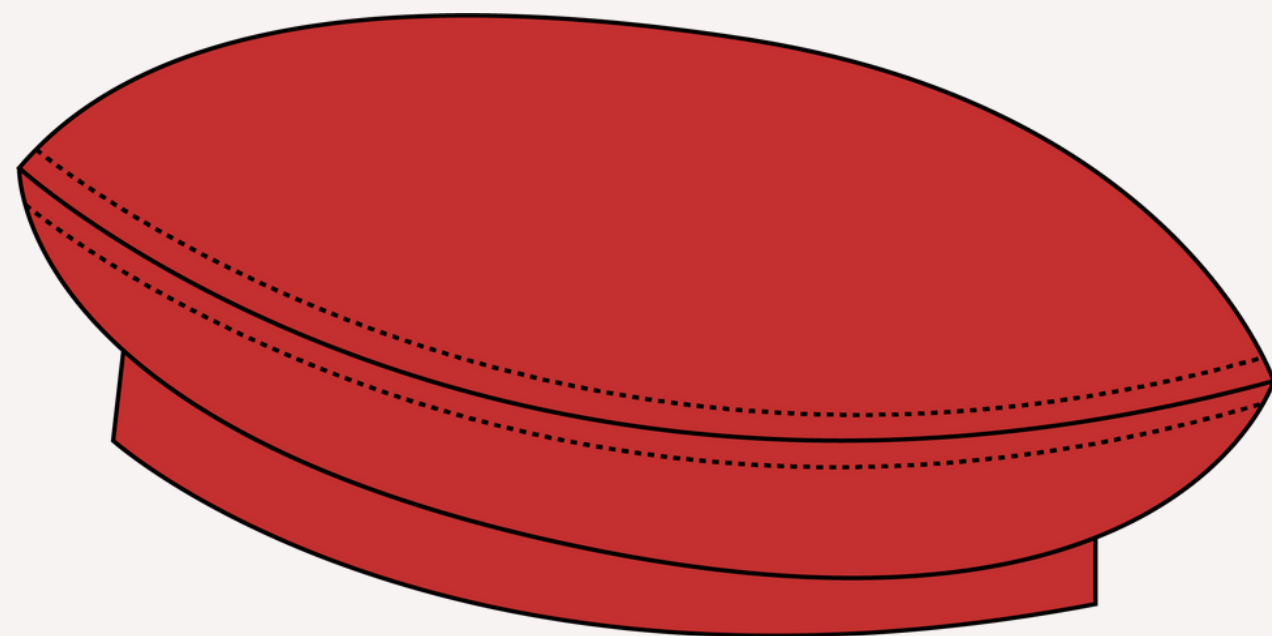


BERET HAT

What do I need when sewing this skirt ?

- Fabric (woven)
- Needle
- Thread
- Sewing machine
- Marker
- Scissors

What fabric and how much fabric do I need when sewing this hat

The fabric you can use while making this hat should not be stretchy. You can use tweed, stamp, fleece, denim, leather, etc. fabrics.

A For all sizes, 1 meter wide and 0.5 meter long fabric is enough to sew this hat.

ASSEMBLING THE PATTERN PIECES

A1	A2	A3	A4	A5
B1	B2	B3	B4	B5
C1	C2	C3	C4	C5
D1	D2	D3	D4	D5

In this PDF die set, you can get your stencil in 2 different paper types.

Each body pattern has been carefully prepared by including seam allowances and sewing trials have been made. When you choose the right size for yourself by using the size chart, the pattern will fit you perfectly.

Make sure you select the correct paper type when printing the patterns. (A4 or US Letter)

In the print settings, mark the print size as 100%.

Check the accuracy of the printing by measuring the test frame after printing.

Then arrange and combine the papers as shown in the diagram on the left.

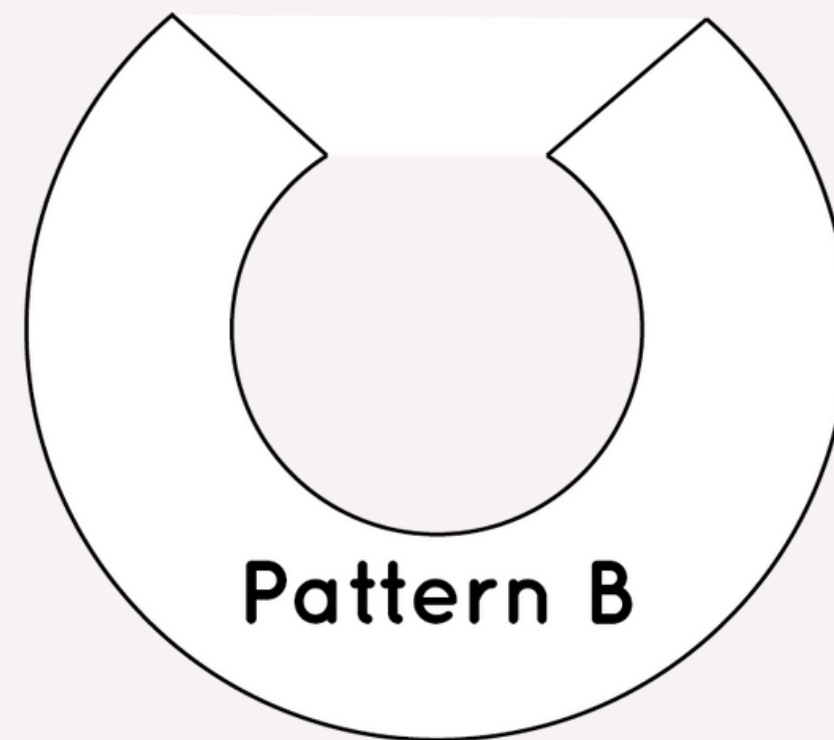
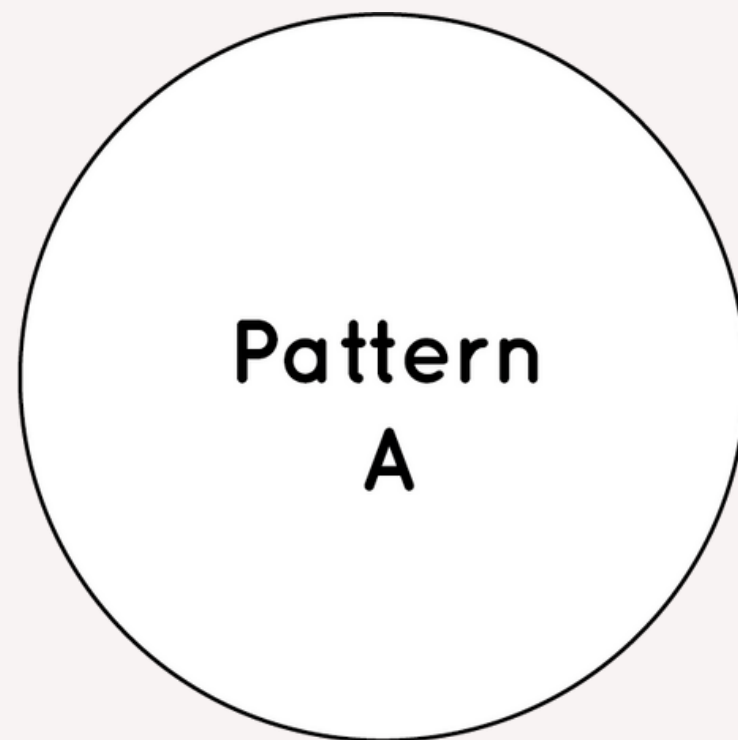
Measure around your head in “cm” and find the suitable size. Cut the patterns you have printed out from the specified places. Fold the fabric in half and lay it on the floor. Place the patterns you cut on the folded edge of the fabric. Pin the pattern to the fabric and cut from the edge of the pattern. How many pieces you will cut is indicated on the patterns.

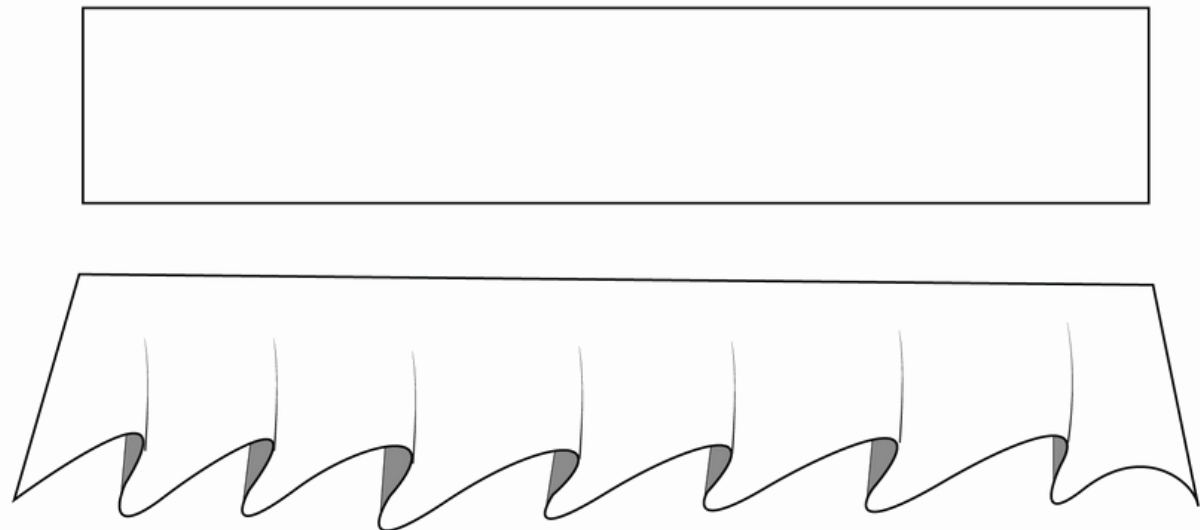
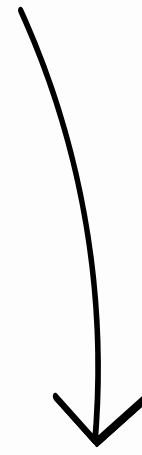
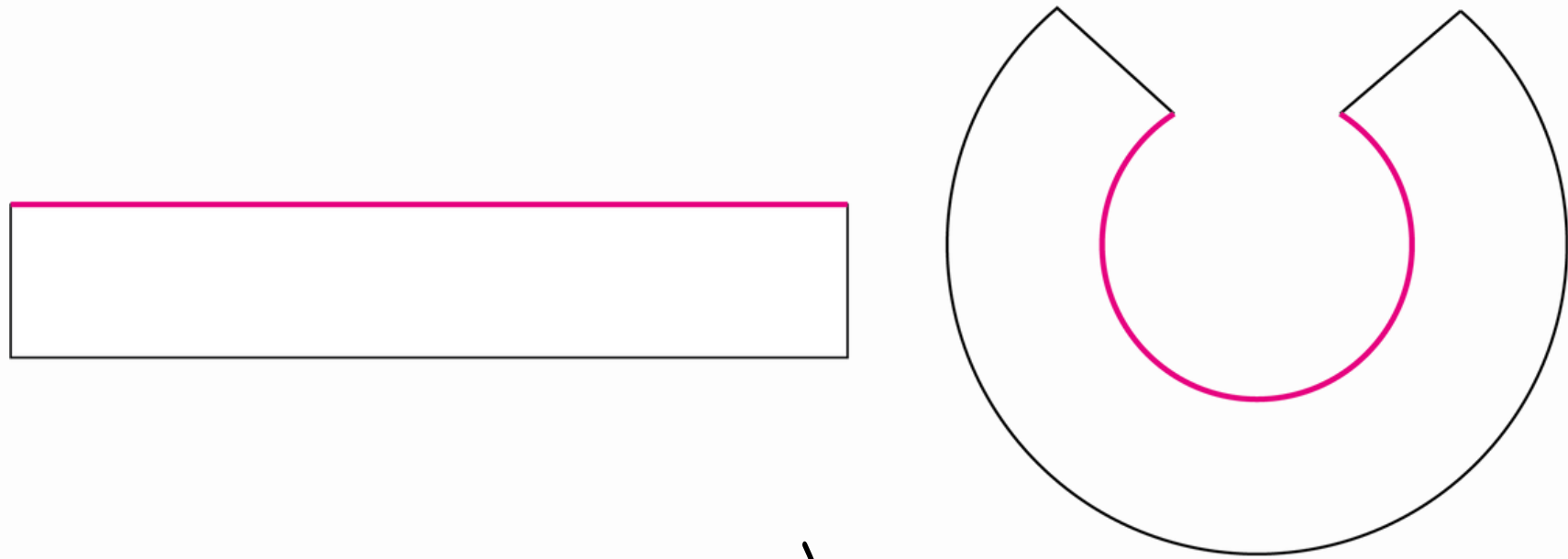
Cut 1 of the top piece.

Cut 1 of the side piece.

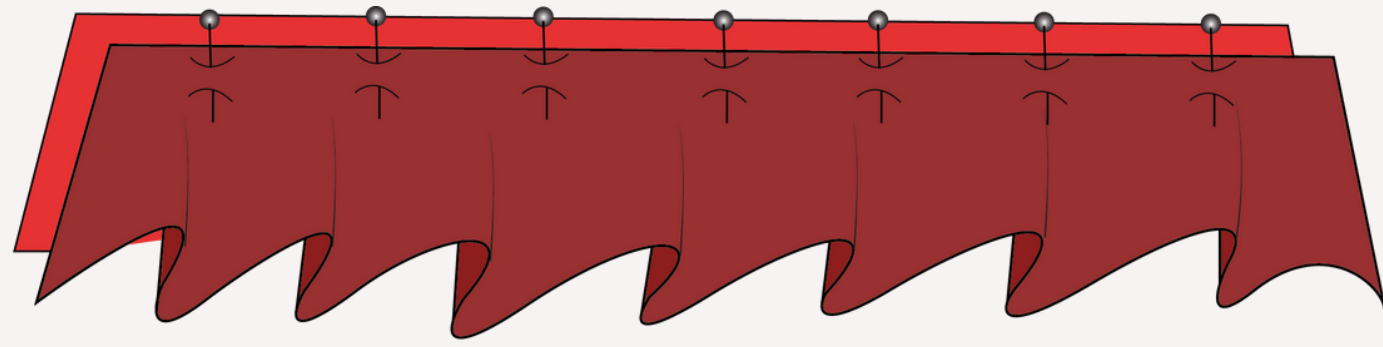
Cut 1 of the headband piece.

After the cutting process, you will have the following

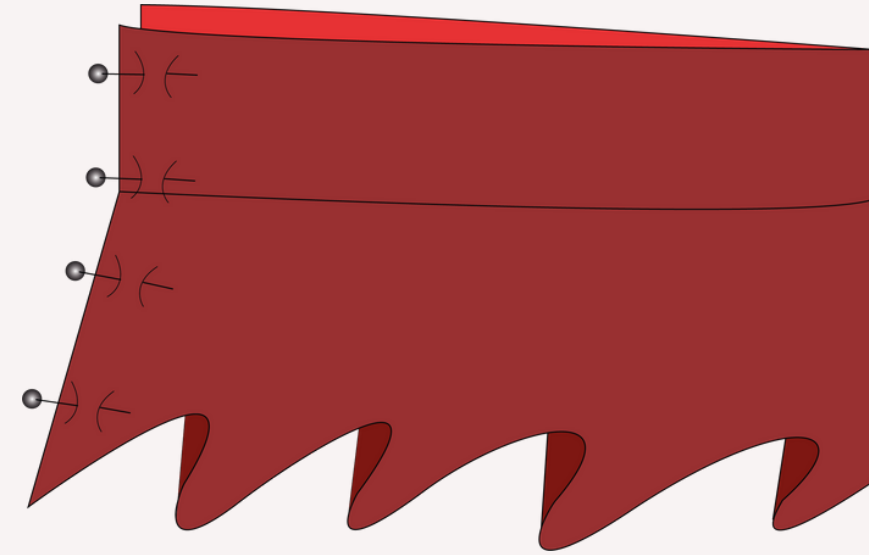
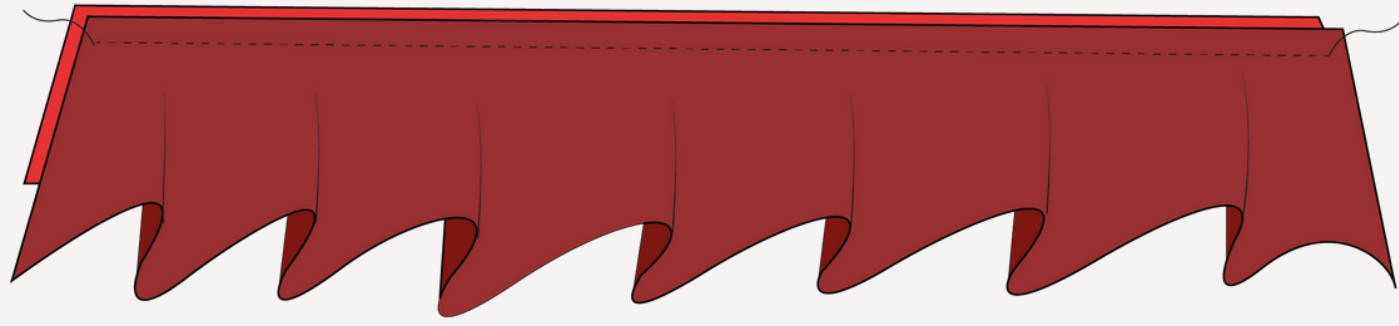




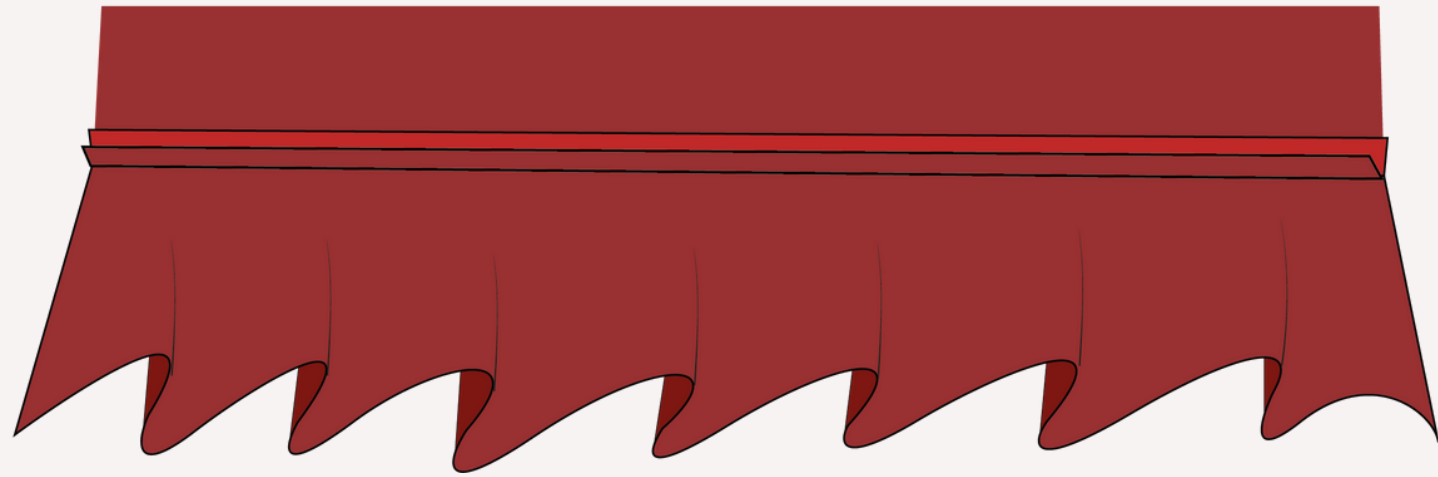
STEP 1: Get parts B and C. Overlap the short edge of part B and the edge of part C with the right sides facing each other. The edges to be sewn are indicated in the diagram below.



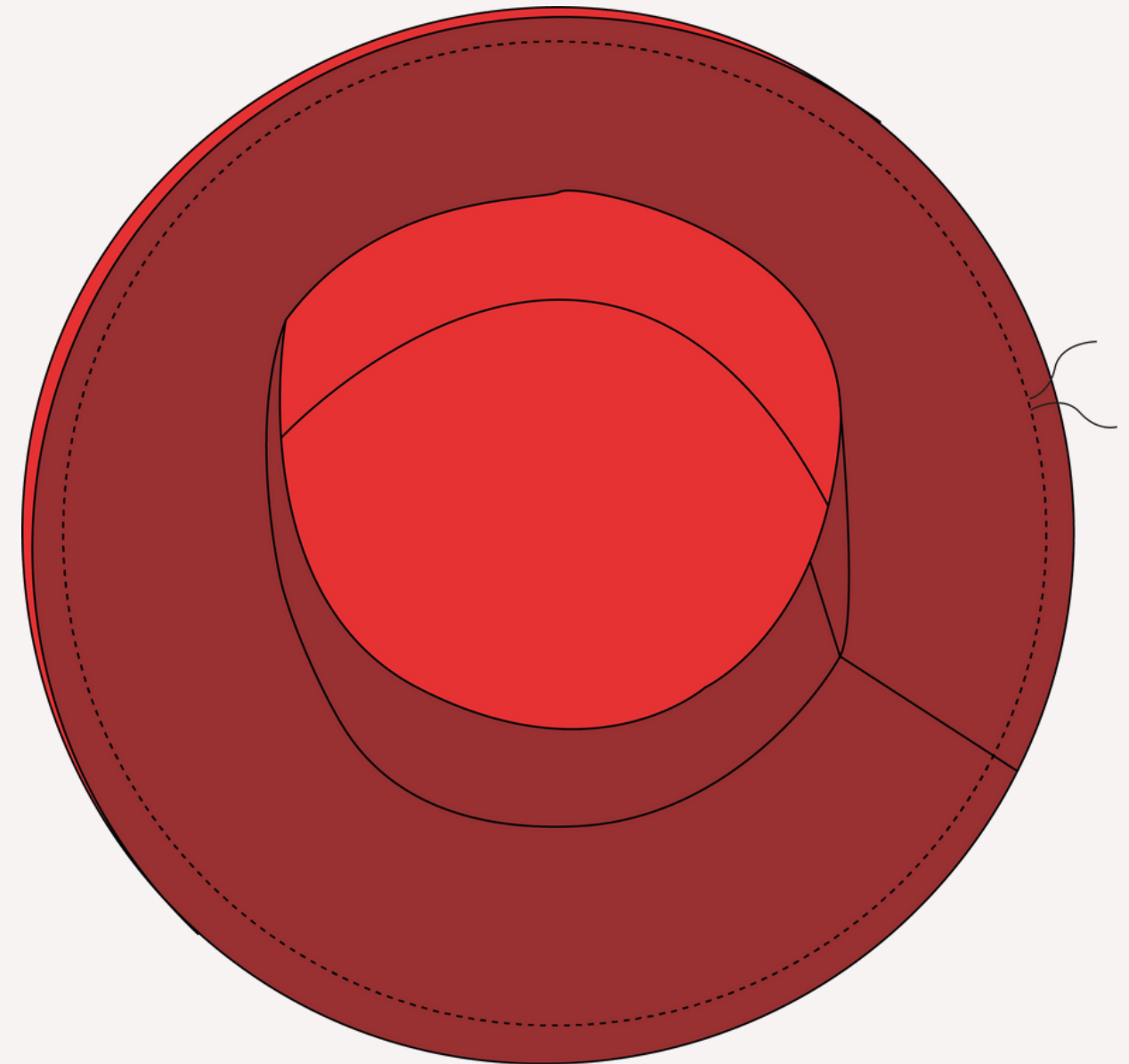
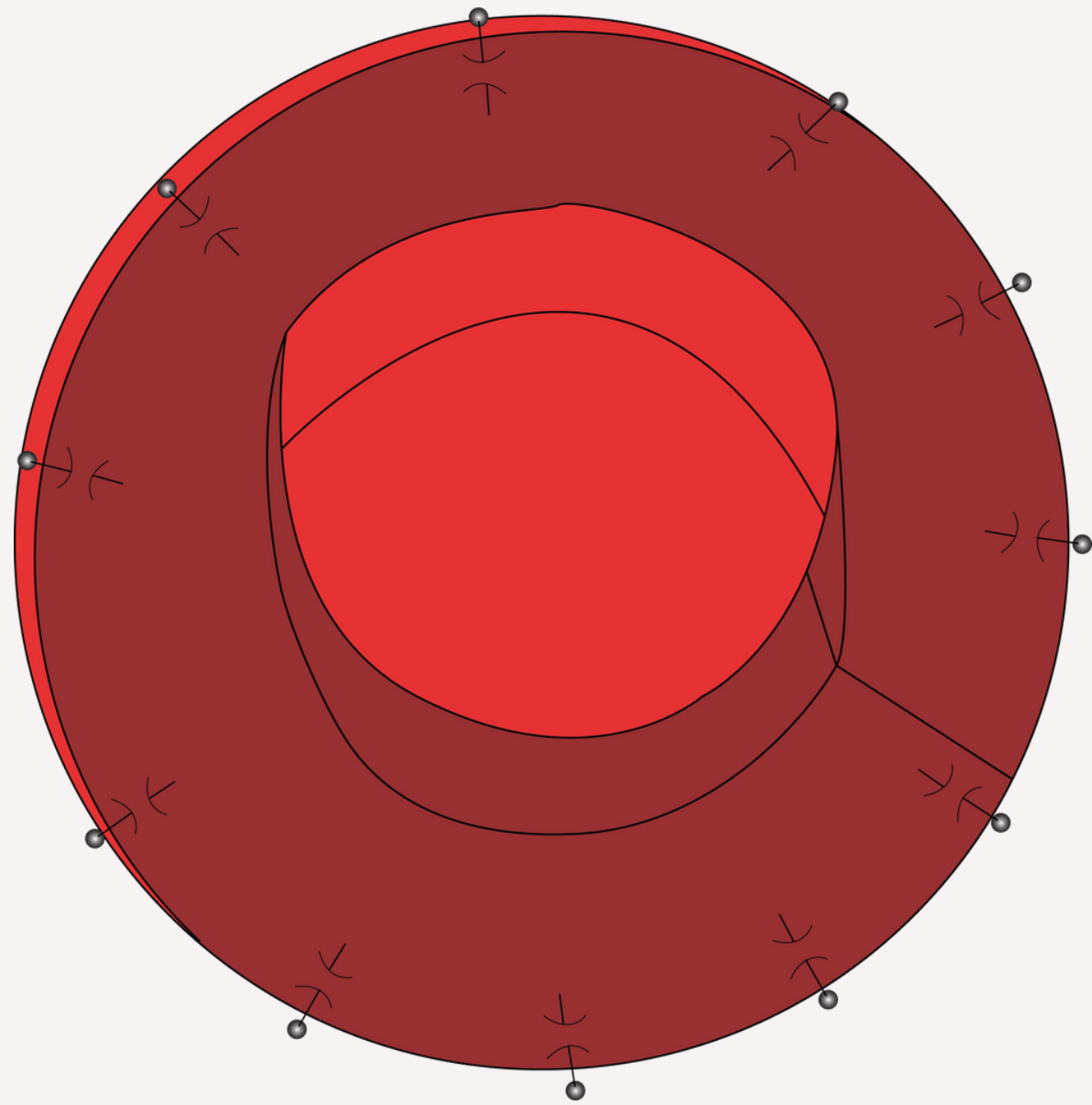
STEP 2: Pin the fabrics together. Sew leaving 1 cm of seam allowance.

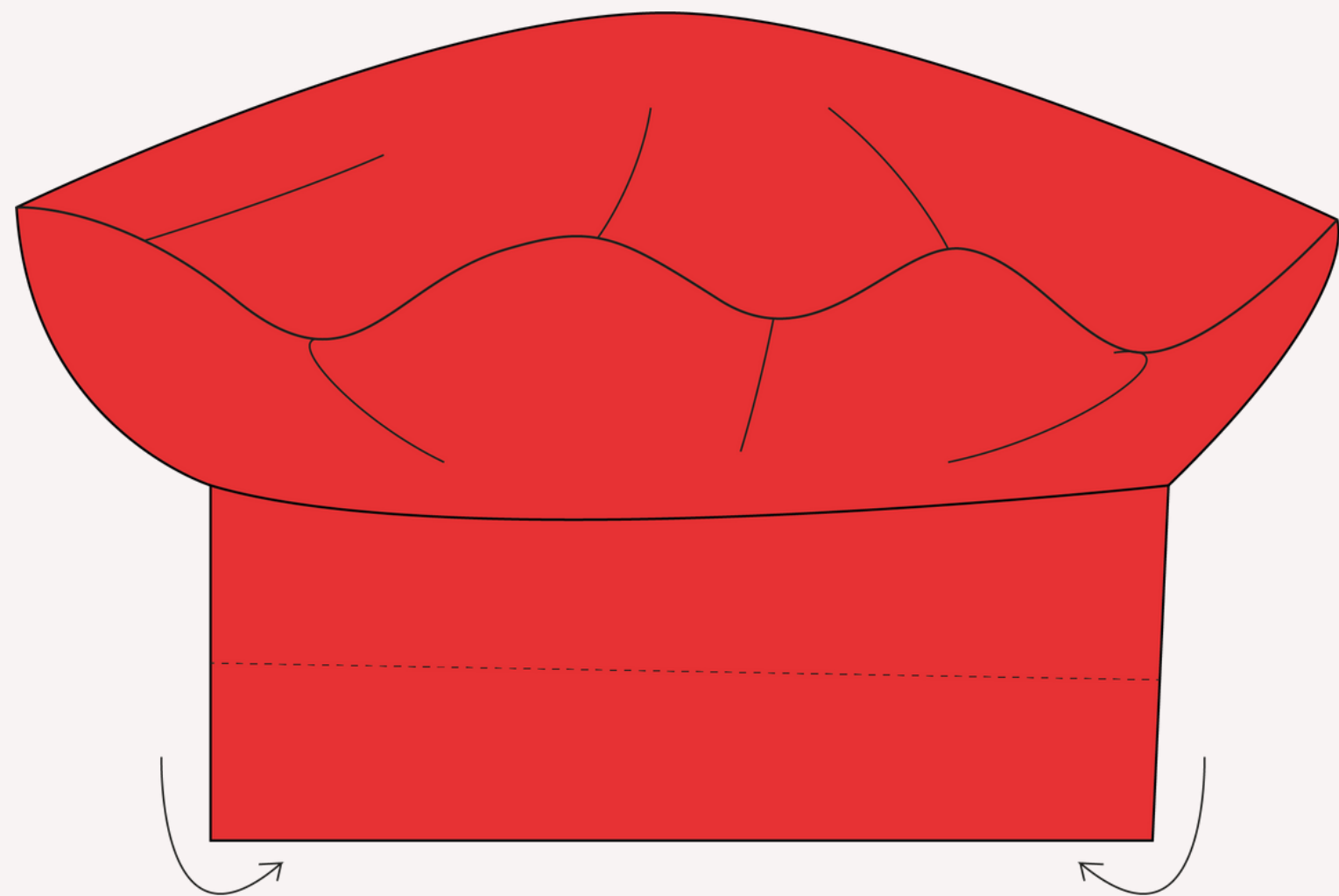


STEP 3: Lay down the wrong side of the piece you're sewing and fold it in half. Pin and sew where indicated.

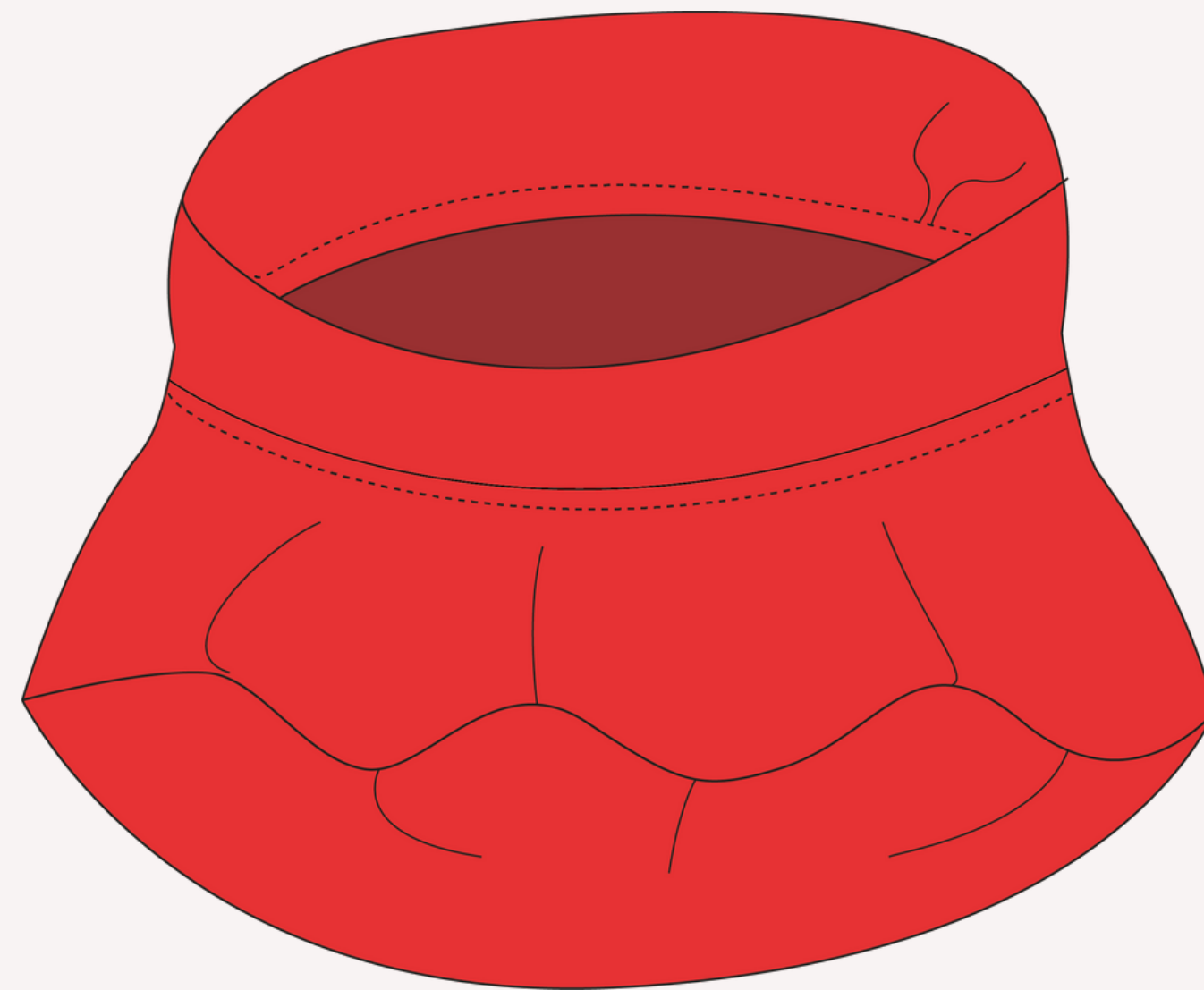


STEP 4: Lay down piece A. The right side of the fabric should be facing up. Lay out the piece you sewed on it. The right sides should face each other. (Shown in the diagram.) Pin and then sew.



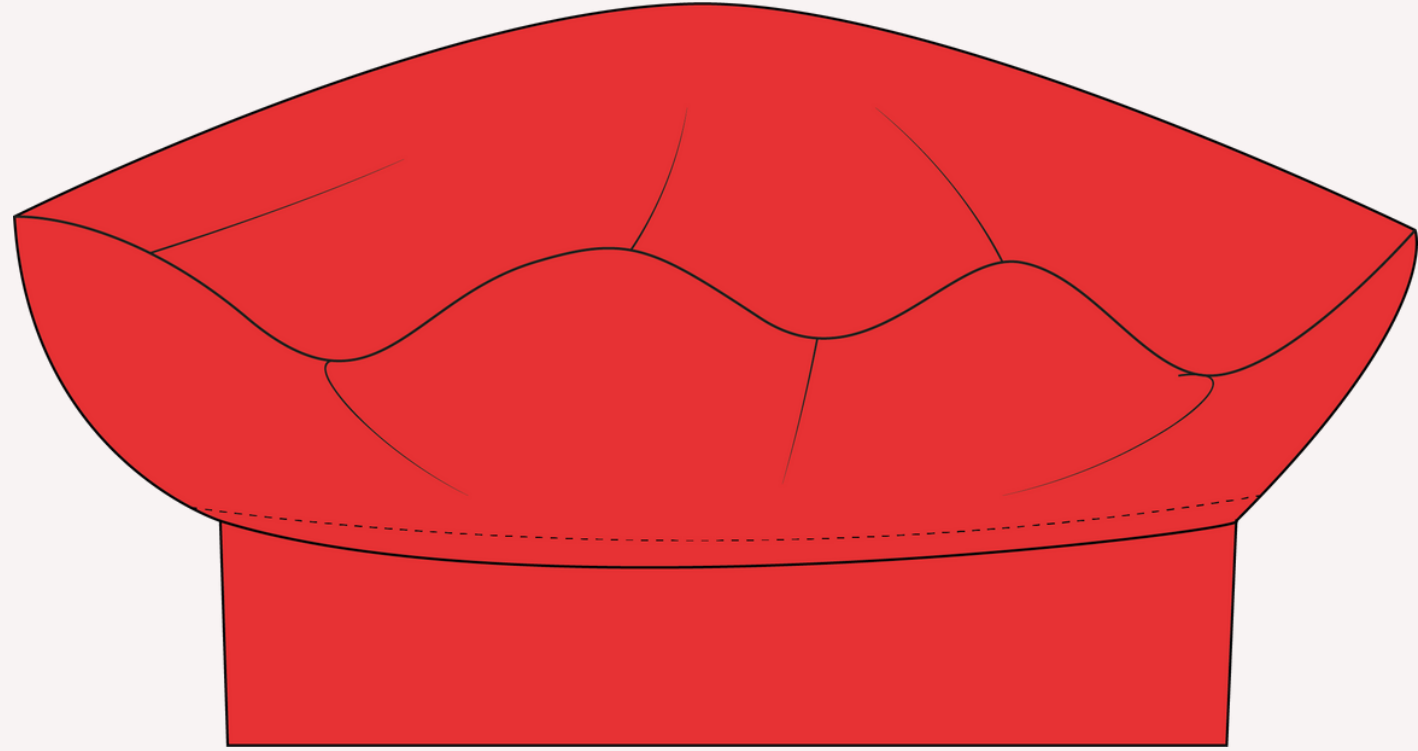


**Fold the edge of
